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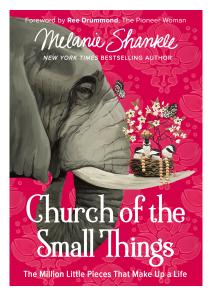

### Hilarious truths gained via hindsight

In sections dubbed "Things I Wish I'd Known," Melanie offers lists of advice on high school, beauty, marriage, God, fashion, parenting and everything in between. Real wisdom is wrapped



in belly laughs, as Melanie makes sharp observations about topics both serious and silly: "That bodysuit that snaps at the crotch that you insist on wearing with high-waisted jeans and a Brighton belt is a mistake."

### Aging

In the aptly titled chapter "Forty is Not the New Thirty," Melanie describes a bathroom cabinet full of potions that promise to turn back time: "I have never used more products on my face than I do at this stage in life, and it all seems a little bit like trying to build a sand castle where the tide is rushing in." With warmth and honesty, Melanie cops to bowing to societal pressures even as she celebrates what staring down her own mortality has given her: the realization that something as mundane as picking a kid up from swim practice is a joy, and that we have each been given so much.

#### Raising a teenager

Melanie writes about her daughter Caroline with love and levity. While acknowledging the unprecedented worry today's parents carry, she also points to the serious issues threatening today's teens. With gentle wisdom, she encourages us to help our kids by modeling compassion and grace.

#### Facing fears in order to become who we're meant to be

"It's easier to sit on your couch than to be out in the world where you're vulnerable and open to being hurt or disappointed," Melanie writes. She urges readers to embrace our unique callings and to chip away at them bravely, day by day.

#### The moments that mark a lasting marriage

In a chapter that begins with the story of how her husband accidentally shot himself in the head while hog hunting from a helicopter and lived to tell the tale, Melanie laughably recounts the small moments that characterize a lasting marriage. "It's never knowing you could love someone so much one minute and then be yelling at them the next minute for something as dumb as not throwing away their Band-Aid wrappers."

#### **Lessons from youth sports**

Melanie owns the soccer mom label and proves why the immersion in youth sports benefits not just the players, but the parents and the entire community. In a moving ode to Abby Wambach's retirement, Melanie celebrates the beauty found when "you've *carpe diemed* the heck out of who and what God has created you to be."

### The everyday forces that shape everything

"Life is what is happening all around us while we're waiting for the thing we hope will give us some sort of inner peace, contentment, or joy," Melanie writes. "The problem is that when and if that thing happens, we usually enjoy it for all of three-and-a-half minutes before realizing nothing in us has fundamentally changed." In both compelling stories and direct pleas for reflection, Melanie encourages us to slow down and think about what we truly want, what we've had in the past and what we have now.

**CHURCH OF THE SMALL THINGS** is instantly relatable because of Melanie's willingness to be personal. As she tells her family's stories, we see ourselves in the hopes and heartbreak—and we're laughing all the way through. A collection that is equal parts profound, hilarious and
